What Is PBI?

Performance-Based Infrastructure (PBI), also commonly called “Public-Private Partnerships” or “P3s,” is a pay-for-performance model of delivering public infrastructure. PBI keeps infrastructure in public ownership and consolidates responsibility for the key phases of a project’s full lifecycle—design, construction, and maintenance—into a performance-based contract with a private partner. PBI procurements can also include elements of private sector financing and operational responsibility.
